

Dear Administrators, Teachers and Friends,

It's time again to make your students and the young people in your community aware of a great opportunity to win a college scholarship by competing in the Youth Poetry Contest during **THE RED STEAGALL COWBOY GATHERING.** This year's event in the Stockyards National Historic District in Fort Worth, will be held **October 28-30, 2016.** Attached to this letter is an entry form and information about our annual Youth Poetry Contest. Please make the students that you are in contact with aware of this event by duplicating entry forms or posting the form where it can be seen. **ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN SEPTEMBER 30, 2016**.

Two categories, a junior division for poets 8-12 and a senior division for poets 13-18 years old are available. First place winners in each division will be awarded a \$3,500 scholarship and the second place winners will each be awarded a \$2,500 scholarship; a total of \$12,000 in scholarship money available!

These entries can be submitted individually or a contest can be held in your classroom or community and the best entries in each division submitted. Such an approach promotes school spirit, encourages language arts and social studies programs within the schools and communities, and provides students with an incentive for studying and writing about cowboy life, the history of Texas or the west.

The first and second place winners in each age division will receive a scholarship to be applied toward college tuition. (Scholarship funds will be provided directly to the college or university of the winner's choice once he or she has been accepted for enrollment.) Each finalist will receive a copy of one of Red Steagall's poetry books and a commemorative medal.

YOUNG WRITERS COWBOY POETRY CONTEST

Rules and Guidelines

- 1. Only one entry per contestant. Contestants must compose their own poems with no assistance from any outside source. **No poem previously submitted can be re-submitted for consideration.**
- 2. Entries will be judged in two divisions:****

 Junior Division contestants ages 8-12 no more than 36 lines of poetry

 Senior Division, contestants ages 13-18 no more than 36 lines of poetry
- 3. Poems must be submitted in the approved format. The poem, along with the requested information will serve as the entry form. Entries may be typewritten, produced on a word processor, or handwritten legibly in pen or pencil.
- 4. Poets should keep a copy of their poem. No entries will be returned.
- 5. All entries must be mailed to the address given below and **postmarked no later than September 30th** in order to be eligible for judging. Ten finalists in each division will be notified by October 10th regarding selection, prizes, scholarship information and rules of final competition. Finalists will be required to recite their poem by memory on Saturday, October 24th at THE RED STEAGALL COWBOY GATHERING held in the Stockyards National Historic District of Fort Worth.
- 6. In order to fulfill its mission of recognizing and rewarding students from the North Texas area, the event will only accept entries from students who attend school in the following counties: Tarrant, Dallas, Young, Jack, Stephens, Shackleford, Erath, Hood, Ellis, Kaufman, Collin, Cooke, Montague, Wise, Denton, Navarro, Fannin, Hunt, Grayson, Comanche, Clay, Archer, Baylor, Wilbarger, Wichita, Callahan, Parker, Palo Pinto, Eastland, Sommervelle, Rockwall and Johnson.
